

#### No Stone Left Alone

On Tuesday, November 8, organized by the Louis Riel School Division and the Elmwood Royal Canadian Legion, poppies were placed on the gravestones of veterans throughout the cemetery by 600 students attending the service. Elmwood Cemetery has approximately 700 graves in its Field of Honour and elsewhere in the Cemetery.

Elmwood is one of only three Cemeteries in Manitoba having an official 'Field of Honour" a National designation honouring our veterans.

On September 4, 1965 Manitoba lost a real "character" when Daniel Roy Hamilton died of

cancer at the age of 69. Born in Neepawa in 1892, the son of Irish immigrant hotel owners, D.R. Hamilton was simply "Roxy" to all who knew him. Full of fun and always on the lookout for a good prank, Roxy would often tell of sneaking into the local radio station in Neepawa and airing his own play-by-play version of a much-anticipated prize fight. He was an Orson Wells before his time. Roxy maintained that the only reason he was not lynched was that he had called the winner correctly.

Neighbours on Henderson Highway thoroughly enjoyed Roxy's sense of humour. They never quite knew what was coming next. For example, they might awaken to several deer or a family of skunks in the back yard; however, these animals never moved. They were Roxy's life-like replicas. He also had a flagpole on the riverbank in his yard where he would fly the Manitoba provincial flag, the Union Jack, the Confederate rebel flag, or the Jolly Roger depending on his mood at the time.

In 1941 Roxy Hamilton was elected to the Manitoba Legislature for the first of three terms he held as the representative of Rupertsland. He and his wife, Mary, represented the Province of Manitoba at the coronation of Queen Elizabeth II in 1953.

Roxy was a man of varied interests. He was made an honourary chief of Pukatawagen Reserve and was called Chief Night Owl because of his ability to stay awake all night. The governor of Kentucky designated him an honourary Colonel since he bred horses and trained them for sulky races. In addition Roxy was a member of the Masons, the Khartum Shriners, and the Order of the Elk. For over thirty years he owned and operated the Aberdeen Hotel in Winnipeg.

On September 7, 1965 Roxy was laid to rest in Elmwood Cemetery. Mary, his second wife, was interred beside him in January of 1986.

Also interred in a nearby family plot are Clara Hamilton, Roxy's first wife, who died tragically in 1936 at the age of 44 and Eileen Golden. She was known as "Goldie" and she had came to Neepawa from Ireland as a young girl. She worked for the Hamiltons at the hotel and became virtually a member of the family. She honoured her promise to Roxy to look after Mary with whom she lived until Mary's placement in a personal care home. Goldie herself passed away in 1983 at the age of 90.



#### Executive Director's Fall Report



After being on the Board of Directors for over 10 years and being "retired" for one month, I found myself as the Executive Director of

this wonderful, historical cemetery on February 1 of this year.

I joined the Board at a time when the original founders of the charity had begun turning the corner to put the property back to the beauty of the past and onto a path of self sufficiency. We all owe those visionaries a tremendous thank you.

The past ten months has seen the Board work on Policies and Procedures, financial reporting, website improvement, significant additions to the inventory of niches at both the original Henderson site and now at a beautiful new site meandering in a former walkway. Projects continue to be planned for future improvements providing budgets make sense.

Friends of Elmwood Cemetery rely heavily on donations to build the perpetual care fund from which half of our operating costs are derived. The remainder of operating dollars comes from interments and various miscellaneous services.

One of the services that takes a great deal of time for the office as well as for the maintenance staff is providing relatives and friends with grave site information and assistance in locating the site. Many sites are unmarked or the flat markers have become overgrown, making physical location difficult.

I believe that this is a vital service and one that may lead to revenue for the cemetery in terms of gravesite sales and donations. In September the cemetery received a grant from the Winnipeg Foundation which will enable us to make significant strides in archiving the cemetery's records in a digital format which will enable people to locate graves on the website, visit the cemetery, and, with their smart device, easily locate the site. Of course not everyone has a device, but the paper based mapping information currently available will be much easier to use. Thanks so much to the Winnipeg Foundation. By the way, visitors to our website, www. historicelmwoodcemetery.ca, can now make donations on the site to the perpetual care fund managed by the Foundation.

The Cemetery will be here forever and the Friends will ensure that it is maintained. Your help is appreciated.

#### The Search for the Telfords

In 1908 a certain Mr. D.H. Telford purchased 20 gravesites in Elmwood Cemetery. These gravesites have gone unused for over one hundred years. From time to time this fact would be puzzled over in the media; however it wasn't until recently that the mystery was solved.

Approximately one week before this newsletter went to press CTV did a story on the history found in cemeteries. Executor Director Jim Baker was shown walking the cemetery with the reporter, and the "mystery" of the Telford site was featured. The very next day three separate research documents were emailed to the cemetery and one to CTV. Several individuals called the cemetery, and in two cases, came to the cemetery in person volunteering to help with research and offer information.

We now know volumes of the life of Mr. Telford and his daughter. She died in California, was buried in Elmwood, and subsequently the remains were returned to California. We know a great deal about the Lumberman Telford and his path from Iowa to Winnipeg, Moose Jaw, and Waldo, British Columbia, with his final days in California.

Thanks to all who helped. The power of television cannot be understated.

#### Financial Information

We continue to be busy at the cemetery despite a 10% drop in the number of interments. The staff has, however, had more time to catch up on deferred maintenance projects this summer.

As in the past we operate without government support and must cover all costs from perpetual trust investment income and from the sales of niches and grave sites.

This year the website has been updated so that online donations will now go directly to The Winnipeg Foundation. The Foundation will immediately issue a charitable receipt from its secure page. This change saves credit card charges and the cost of mailing receipts.

Major work has been completed on columbaria niches. A new site has been installed in Section 14 and installations have been completed at Henderson Gate. This provides an inventory of over 400 niches for sale in different areas of the cemetery. Please note that there are also several hundred grave sites available for purchase.

Next year we will acquire a new tractor and we will begin the repair of the Henderson Highway fence. This will be a significant, but necessary, expense for the cemetery.

We thank you again for your generous support over the years. We are half way to our goal of \$50,000 in donations for the year and we hope that you will consider us in your year end charitable donations. All donations are placed into the perpetual care fund held at The Winnipeg Foundation. Every dollar donated provides investment income in perpetuity to help support the cemetery.
